**ORDINANCE NO. 95-080**

**AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING AN ECOLOGICAL WASTE MANAGEMENT PROGRAM IN THE CITY OF NAGA: -**

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Be it ordained by the Sangguniang Panlungsod of the City of Naga, that:

**SECTION 1. - TITLE OF THE ORDINANCE.** - This ordinance shall be known as “AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING AN ECOLOGICAL WASTE MANAGEMENT PROGRAM IN THE CITY OG NAGA”:

**SECTION 2. - SCOPE OF THE ORDINANCE** - This ordinance shall embrace all activities involving collection; segregation, disposal, recovery and recycling of refuse resources and the converting of compostable portion thereof into bio-Organic fertilizer;

The operation of such activities shall first and foremost be the public market areas, then the business and industrial establishments, households and institutions in the City more particularly but not necessarily limited to the Central Business District.

**SECTION 3. - DEFINITION OF TERMS** - As shall be used in this ordinance, the following terms shall be construed thus:

- a) Ecological Waste Management – As systematic methodology in the collection, segregation, disposal and recovery of refuse resources (waste) in the entire community to attain ecological balance of institutions.
- b) Refuse resource – shall be used here as synonymous to garbage intended to be disposed by market stall owners, households, business establishments and institutions.
- c) Market stall owners – are those occupying stalls whether temporarily or permanently at the Public Market and Satellite Markets in the Central Business District.
- d) Business establishments – are those occupying public or private units in the Central Business District other than those in the publicly operated markets.
- e) Households – all residential units in the entire communities and barangay being served by the garbage disposal system of the city.
- f) Institutions – are schools, offices and establishments public or private, other than business establishments within the served area.
- g) Refuse intervenors – these are the persons individually or collectively intervening in the present garbage collection and disposal better known as scavengers being served by the garbage disposal system of the city.
- h) Management Staff – shall refer to the Council Staff organized purposely to manage the affairs of this project.
- i) Biodegradable waste resources – all refuse resources that are basically compostable.

- j) Non-bio-degradable – all waste resources that are mainly non-decomposable or do not readily decay.
- k) Recover/recycling – shall mean setting aside or saving non- biodegradable waste so that the same may be sold or re-used for other purposes.
- l) Segregation of Waste – a process whereby refuse (waste) resources are segregated manually or mechanically by kind either at source or at the garbage dumpsite, to facilitate such disposal and recovery thereof.
- m) Conversion to bio-organic fertilizer shall mean the process and technology by which biodegradable refuse resources are turned into bio organic fertilizer without chemical mixtures the latter for use as agricultural fertilizer.
- n) Equipment here shall refer to the machine units to be used for the collection, delivery of waste resources and the conversion process of producing bio-organic fertilizer as well as the structuring and maintenance of the dumpsite and fertilizer plant.

**SECTION 4. - PROJECT MANAGEMENT STAFF. -**

- a) This project shall be administered by a management staff patterned after the Council for Sustainable Development, composed of the following:

All of the above-named officers and members who are employees of the City Government of Naga shall serve on a voluntary basis without compensation except those who are not such government employees who maybe entitled to the usual travel expenses and honorarium the latter to be determined by the management staff.

**SECTION 5. - MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT. -** Considering that this project needs technical as well as technological advice, at its inception, a Memorandum of Agreement shall be formulated with the President or Chairman of whichever Consultant Firm chosen by the Management Staff with wide and actual experience on this project, the DENR, the DOST, the assisting government agencies and the City Government of Naga, for a period of at least one operating year.

**SECTION 6. - EDUCATIONAL CAMPAIGN -** Preparatory to the actual launching of the project, the management staff shall conduct a series of information and educational campaign among the participants of all affected areas such as the public market, the satellite markets, the business and industrial establishments and the households of the Central Business District in a manner that they will have a working knowledge of the importance and necessity of refuse resource management, its proper collection, disposal and recovery (recycling) as intended by the project.

**SECTION 7. - USE OF GOVERNMENT EQUIPMENT & RESOURCES. -**

- a) The present equipment and support personnel being utilized in garbage collection and disposal systems shall be used fully by this project with a possible augmentation as maybe determined by the management staff and according to availability of funds.
- b) New equipment in the form of a mobile shredding machine with two-trailer attachment shall be secured initially to start the fertilizer conversion project.
- c) The mixers and hammer mill as well as other essential equipment shall also be procured as the project goes in full scale and funds become available.
- d) Dumpsite – The present garbage dumpsite owned by the City Government of Naga situated at Barangay Balatas shall be used as the same site for all the delivery of waste resource mentioned herein, and the same shall be developed at the same time as a plant site for Bio-Organic Fertilizer conversion, storage of recycling materials, exchange centers for dealership of such materials and possibly into an Eco-Center for sustainable development on agriculture and trade.
- e) Cooperative for traders and refuse intervenors – The marginal waste resource intervenors (Scavengers) now deriving livelihood from the present refuse resources of the City at the market site, at the dumpsite as well as on the roadsides shall be carefully organized to prevent dislocation of their present livelihood efforts, they will be organized into cooperatives with the end in view or converting them onto participant labor force, traders and entrepreneurs in the project. This will be the responsibility of the management staff.

**SECTION 8. - PROJECT TIMETABLE -** For such an important project to take off the following tentative schedule is desired:

- a) Upon approval of this ordinance up to November 15, 1995, the educational campaign.
- b) Formal launching of the project – November 17, 1995.
- c) First monitoring and Evaluation & Awarding Ceremonies, January 6, 1996.
- d) Every two months thereafter, assessment and evaluation of the project.
- e) It is understood that the initial concentration of the project activities is at the public market area. It will spill out into the households and other areas the project progresses.

**SECTION 9. - A SYSTEM OF INCENTIVES. -**

- a) All participants, market stall owners, business and industrial establishments and institutions now being required to pay by the city, garbage collection fees under their annual Mayor's Permit shall be given a 50% discount of such fees for the first year of implementation of the project if they comply with the standard procedures on segregation and complying their refuse resources (Garbage) at source, such standards and procedures will be furnished them by the management staff at the launching of the project. The possibility of altogether deleting the garbage fee under such mayor's permit will be considered by the management staff later for participants who strictly comply with such standards herein mentioned. Plaques of recognition shall be from time to time to be awarded.
- b) All general services personnel included in this project shall be awarded special bonus or grade step increases in compensation based on their individual performance in this project as evaluated and recommended by the management staff. Plaques of recognition shall also be awarded accordingly.

**SECTION 10. - PENALTIES. -**

- a. Refusal of any owner of stalls of market, business or industrial establishment or institutions and later on household owners covered by the refuse resource management project particularly in the Central Business District, to comply with the standards
