ORDINANCE NO. 2004-002

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING A LOCALIZED “TINAMPO TA, ATAMANON TA” PROGRAM IN THE CITY OF NAGA WITH CERTAIN MODIFICATIONS TO SERVE AS AN EMERGENCY EMPLOYMENT ASSISTANCE TO ITS CONSTITUENTS AND APPROPRIATING THE AMOUNT OF THREE MILLION PESOS (P3,000,000.00) FOR THE PURPOSE CHARGEABLE AGAINST CY 2003 UNAPPROPRIATED SURPLUS: -

SECTION 1. - TITLE. - This ordinance shall be known as the Localized “Tinampo Ta, Atamanon Ta” Program.

SECTION 2. - COVERAGE. - The program shall cover projects and activities implemented by administration within the territorial jurisdiction of Naga City Government.

SECTION 3. - SCOPE. - The projects and activities to be implemented by administration under this program shall include:

- a. desilting of longitudinal drainage canal and pipes and cross drains;
- b. cutting of vegetation along shoulders up to the road right-of-way limits;
- c. removal of obstruction within the road right-of-way;
- d. reshaping of gravel and/or earth shoulders;
- e. cleaning of sidewalks, garbage collection, and disposal;
- f. immediate response to calamities and other emergencies;
- g. render necessary assistance to motorists;
- h. planting and maintenance of appropriate plants;
- i. maintenance of parks/plazas, playgrounds, and street islands;
- j. maintenance of water systems, electrical installations, and sports facilities;
- k. construction of community infrastructure projects;
- l. and other frontline services as may be determined by the City Mayor.

SECTION 4. - OBJECTIVES. - The projects and activities implemented by administration under this program shall have the following objectives:

- a. use labor-based tools-supported method in undertaking projects and activities;
- b. serve as an emergency employment assistance to city residents;
- c. generate employment among marginalized workers;
- d. train the unskilled laborers for greater employability;
- e. ensure year-round and all weather maintenance of government facilities;
- f. develop a sense of responsibility among city residents;
- g. for the city residents to appreciate the dignity of work;
- h. and pump-prime the local economy.

SECTION 5. - WORKFORCE. - In hiring the laborers to form the workforces, the following shall be observed:

- a. the workers are city residents for at least six months;
- b. the workers belong to the marginalized sector such as but not limited to the unemployed, underemployed, out-of-school youth, off-peak agricultural workers, displaced workers, informal settlers, urban poor;
- c. the workers are not first degree-relatives;
- d. one (1) female worker is hired to each workforce,
- e. and workers covered by the Bayadnihan Program under Ordinance No. 2001-078 are automatically qualified to participate.

SECTION 6. - WAGE RATE AND DURATION. - Each worker shall be paid One Hundred Fifty Pesos (P150.00) for an eight (8) hour work per day for a minimum of one (1) month and a maximum of three (3) months.

SECTION 7. - UNIFORM AND TOOLS. - Each worker shall be provided with uniformed t-shirts while basic maintenance tools shall also be available, as may be necessary, through a Memorandum Receipt (MR) and the workers shall ensure its proper use/care.

SECTION 8. - IMPLEMENTING OFFICES. - The City Planning and Development Office (CPDO), the Metro Naga Public Employment Service Office (Metro PESO), the City Engineer's Office (CEO), the Environment and Natural Resources Office (ENRO), the General Services Department (GSD), the City Accountant's Office (CAO), and the City Treasurer's Office (CTO) shall be responsible for the implementation of this ordinance.

SECTION 9. - COORDINATING COMMITTEE. - For purposes of ensuring the effective implementation of this ordinance, a Coordinating Committee is hereby created to be composed by all the Department Heads of the implementing offices. The City Planning and Development Coordinator shall chair the committee and the City PESO Manager shall act as its Secretariat. Subject to the approval of the City Mayor and in order to standardized implementation of this program, the committee may, from time to time, issue guidelines to, among others, detail the operating procedures, clarify complementation and accountabilities and personnel involved, fix the timetable for the performance of their functions, and standardized the forms, documents and processes involved.

SECTION 10. - DETERMINATION OF SERVICES RENDERED. - The City Engineer, the City Environment and Natural Resources Officer, and the General Services Officer shall be primarily responsible for the supervision and monitoring of all projects and activities falling under their respective regular functions and jurisdiction. While, the City PESO Manager shall be responsible for those outside the CEO, ENRO, and GSD concerns.

SECTION 11. - APPROPRIATION. - The amount of Three Million Pesos (P 3,000,000.00) is hereby appropriated for this purpose chargeable against CY 2003 unappropriated surplus.

SECTION 12. - SEPARABILITY CLAUSE. - If any portion or provision of this ordinance is declared unconstitutional, the same shall not affect the validity and effectivity of the rest of this ordinance.

SECTION 13. - REPEALING CLAUSE. - Ordinances, executive orders, rules and regulations, and other issuances of the city government, or parts thereof, inconsistent with this ordinance are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

SECTION 14. - EFFECTIVITY. - This ordinance shall take effect upon its approval.
