RESOLUTION EXPRESSING THE CITY OFFICIALDOM'S
CONGRATULATIONS TO THE BICOL COLLEGE OF ARTS AND TRADE
(ORIGINALLY NAMED CAMARINES SUR TRADE SCHOOL AND NOW
CAMARINES SUR POLYTECHNIC COLLEGES-NAGA CAMPUS) ON ITS
CENTENNIAL FOUNDATION ANNIVERSARY THIS MONTH OF MARCH
2011:-

WHEREAS, the Camarines Sur Polytechnic Colleges-Naga Campus is celebrating its 100th year Foundation Anniversary this March 2011 - a solid proof of its core strength, unmistakable relevance and unswerving dedication to Bicol and its people;

WHEREAS, the school traces its humble beginnings in 1911 to the then Camarines Sur Trade School (CSTS), a school created by the Provincial Government, when Pedro Hidalgo, one of its pioneers, organized trade courses in the intermediate level, offering carpentry, drawing and trade arts in classes temporarily held at the Library Hall of then Camarines Sur High School;

WHEREAS, in 1952, through the initiative of then Congressman Emilio Tible, Republic Act No. 825 was enacted, nationalizing the CSTS, renaming it as Camarines Sur National School of Arts and Trades (CSNSAT), and likewise ordering the Provincial Government to transfer to the National Government, free of charge, the school site, buildings, machineries, hand tools, books, materials, shop equipment, etcetera, belonging to the CSTS;

WHEREAS, in 1967, through the initiative of then Congressman Ramon Felipe, Jr., Republic Act No. 5056 was enacted, converting the school into a college, naming it as Bicol College of Arts and Trade (BCAT), and requiring the school to offer an additional course, the Bachelor of Science in Industrial Education;

WHEREAS, it was only in mid-1980s that the school formally adopted the name Bicol College of Arts and Trade (BCAT) and there were years when it was called Camarines Sur National College of Arts and Trade (CSNCAT);

WHEREAS, pursuant to pertinent provisions of RA 7722, RA 8292 and RA 8760, and in consonance to Commission on Higher Education (CHED) Memorandum Order No. 27, Series of 2000, the school was eventually integrated to Camarines Sur Polytechnic Colleges in Nabua; and subsequently, by virtue of CSPC Board of Trustees Resolution No. 00-044, the school became Camarines Sur Polytechnic Colleges (CSPC)-Naga Campus;

WHEREAS, from 1911 up to the present, while the school has grown by leaps and bounds and undergone various changes in its name, it continues to serve generations of Bicolanos and remains to this day as a premier school for Vocational Technology and Teacher Education;

WHEREAS, as an academic institution and the only state college here in the city, the school significantly contributes to the development of Naga as well as to the city's vital role as the center of education in the Bicol Region;

NOW, THEREFORE, on joint and collective motion by the Members of the 10th Sangguniang Panlungsod of the City of Naga;

BE IT RESOLVED, as it is hereby resolved, to express the City Officialdom's congratulations and well wishes to the Bicol College of Arts and Trade (originally named Camarines Sur Trade School and now Camarines Sur Polytechnic Colleges-Naga Campus) on its Centennial Foundation Anniversary this March 2011.

LET COPIES of this resolution be furnished His Honor, The City Mayor for his concurrence, and the Office of the President, CSPC and the Campus Director of CSPC Naga, for their information and as a record for posterity.
