



### EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 2022-001

#### PROVIDING GUIDELINES ON THE IMPLEMENTATION OF ALERT LEVEL 3 FOR COVID-19 RESPONSE IN NAGA CITY

WHEREAS, Naga City is among the local government units escalated by the Inter-Agency Task Force for the Management of Emerging Infectious Diseases (IATF) to Alert Level 3 effective 09 January 2022 until 15 January 2022 pursuant to its Resolution No. 156-A, Series of 2022 dated January 06, 2022 due to the sudden increase in COVID19 cases just after the holidays;

WHEREAS, contact tracing data shows significant number of confirmed patients have recent travels to the National Capital Region;

WHEREAS, based on Analytics latest data, Naga's 7-day average has again increased to 12 positive cases a day while positivity rate has likewise climbed back to 28%;

NOW THEREFORE, I, NELSON S. LEGACION, Mayor of Naga City, by virtue of the powers vested in me by law and pursuant to pertinent rules issued by the Inter-Agency Task Force for the Management of Emerging Infectious Diseases (IATF), do hereby issue the following guidelines on the COVID-19 Alert Level 3 Response:

#### RULE I ENTRY TO ESTABLISHMENTS

- An individual must be able to present the following documents to the guardon-duty or designated inspection personnel at the main entrance of the building or facility to be allowed entry to any commercial, private, and public establishments as well as places of worship:
  - Identification Card indicating that the person is eighteen (18) years old and above;
  - Vaccination Card or its absence a negative antigen or RT-PCR test which shall be valid within 48 hours from the date and time of the test
  - E-Salvar QR Code or in its absence submission of the duly accomplished health declaration and contact tracing form (Annex 1)
- The above age-based restriction and documentary requirements shall not apply to persons involved in emergencies and those accessing medical care.
- Failure of heads of establishments and places of worship to impose this rule and other succeeding applicable rules shall be prosecuted for non-



cooperation of the person or entities punishable under Section 9 par. (d) or (e), as the case may be, of Republic Act No. 11332, otherwise known as the Mandatory Reporting of Notifiable Diseases and Health Events of Public Health Concern Act, and its Implementing Rules and Regulations.

## RULE II TRAVEL TO NAGA CITY FROM OTHER REGIONS

- Travelers from other regions who will be staying in Naga City, to be granted entry, must be:
  - Eighteen (18) years old and above as supported by a valid identification card.
  - b. Fully vaccinated as supported by a vaccination card
  - COVID-19 negative as supported by a negative antigen or RT-PCR test result taken within 48 hours before departure from place of origin
  - d. Asymptomatic or without symptoms as declared in the duly accomplished health declaration and contact tracing form (ANNEX 1)
  - e. Approved S-Pass Travel Permit (https://www.s-pass.ph/)
- The above age-based restriction and documentary requirements shall not apply to persons involved in emergencies and those accessing medical care.
- The above documents shall be presented to following authorities upon arrival:

## RULE III PROHIBITED ACTIVITIES

- The following establishments and/or activities characterized as high-risk for transmission shall not be allowed to operate, or be undertaken in areas classified under Alert Level 3:
  - Face to face or in-person classes for basic education, except those previously approved by the IATF and/or the Office of the President;
  - Contact sports, except those conducted under a bubble-type setup as provided for under relevant guidelines adopted by the IATF, Games and Amusement Board, and Philippine Sports Commission, and approved by the LGU where such games shall be held;



- Funfairs/peryas and kid amusement industries such as playgrounds, playroom, and kiddie rides;
- Venues with live voice or wind-instrument performers and audiences such as in karaoke bars, clubs, concert halls, and theaters;
- Cockfighting and operation of cockpits, lottery and betting shops, bingo boutiques and other gaming establishments except as may be authorized by the IATF or the Office of the President; and
- Gatherings in residences with individuals not belonging to the same household.

#### RULE IV

#### LIMITATION ON OPERATION OF CERTAIN ESTABLISHMENTS

- The establishments, or activities enumerated hereunder shall be allowed to operate or be undertaken subject to the following conditions:
  - a. at a maximum of 30% indoor venue capacity for fully vaccinated 18 years old and above individuals only.
  - at a maximum 50% outdoor venue capacity for at least partially vaccinated 18 years old and above individuals
  - all on-site workers/employees, and organizers of activities are fully vaccinated against COVID-19 and
  - Minimum Public Health Standards shall be strictly maintained.
- Establishments and activities allowed to operate subject to above limitations:
  - Venues for meetings, incentives, conferences, and exhibitions (MICE)
  - DOT-accredited venues for social events such as parties, wedding receptions, engagement parties, wedding anniversaries, debut and birthday parties, family reunions, and bridal or baby showers
  - Visitor or tourist attractions such as libraries, archives, museums, galleries, exhibits, parks, plazas, public gardens, scenic viewpoints or overlooks, and the like
  - d. Amusement parks or theme parks
  - Recreational venues such as internet cafes, billiard halls, amusement arcades, bowling alleys, skating rinks, archery halls, swimming pools, and similar venues
  - Cinemas and movie houses




- Limited face-to-face or in-person classes for higher education and for technical-vocational education and training
- In-person religious gatherings; gatherings for necrological services, wakes, inurnment, and funerals for those who died of causes other than COVID-19 and for the cremains of the COVID-19 deceased
- Licensure or entrance/qualifying examinations administered by their respective government agency, and specialty examinations authorized by the IATF subject to the health and safety guidelines as approved by the IATF
- j. Dine-in services in food preparation establishments such as kiosks, commissaries, restaurants, and eateries, subject to DTI sectorspecific protocols
- k. Personal care establishments such as barbershops, hair spas, hair salons, and nail spas, and those offering aesthetic/cosmetic services or procedures, make-up services, salons, spas, reflexology, and other similar procedures including home service options, subject to the sector-specific protocols of the DTI
- Fitness studios, gyms, and venues for non-contact exercise and sports, subject to DTI sector-specific protocols. Provided that patrons/clients and workers/employees wear face masks always and that no group activities are conducted; and
- m. Film, music, and television production, subject to the joint guidelines as may be issued by the DTI, DOLE, and the DOH.

# RULE V PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION

- Jeepneys and buses shall only operate at 70% passenger capacity per LTRFB Circular No. 2021-064.
- The following public utility vehicles shall limit their passenger capacity to what has been authorized under City Ordinance No. 2021-089:

a.	Trimobiles with regular and special franchises	Three (3) passengers
b.	Taxicles and etrikes	Four (4) passengers
c.	Padyak	Two (2) passengers

Drivers of all public utility vehicles must be fully vaccinated.





#### RULE VI GOVERNMENT OPERATIONS

- Agencies and instrumentalities of the government shall remain to be fully operational and shall adhere to at least a 60% on-site workforce.
- Those assigned to work off-site shall be subject to alternative work arrangements as approved by the head of agency in accordance with the relevant rules and regulations issued by the Civil Service Commission (CSC).
- Heads of agencies providing health and emergency frontline services, laboratory and testing services, border control, or other critical services shall operate at a workforce beyond the minimum as may be necessary to deliver their mandates.

#### RULE VII

#### PROTOCOL ON ISOLATION OF CONFIRMED PATIENTS AND TESTING AND QUARANTINE OF CLOSE CONTACTS

- The following protocols shall govern the isolation of confirmed COVID-19 patients:
  - a. Patients who remained asymptomatic or those with mild or moderate symptoms may be allowed to isolate at home for a minimum of ten (10) days if fully vaccinated and minimum of fourteen (14) days for partially or unvaccinated individuals on the following conditions:
    - Pass both the clinical and social criteria under the Assessment Checklist of Clinical and Social Criteria for COVID-19 Home Isolation (ANNEX 2).
    - Submission of duly accomplished PhilHealth Claim Signature Form (CSF) (TO BE PROVIDED BY BHERT).
    - Submission of signed authorization and consent to Participate in Teleconsultation (TO BE PROVIDED BY BHERT).
    - Submission of duly signed acknowledgement of COVID-19 Home Isolation Kit (TO BE PROVIDED BY BHERT).
  - b. Those failing in the prescribed clinical and social criteria shall be isolated in the City's Isolation Facility for a minimum of 14 days or upon the advice of the attending physician.
  - c. Regardless of vaccination status, severe and critical patients shall be isolated in the designated COVID-19 hospitals or in a city isolation facility should the COVID-19 hospitals becomes full and unavailable for a minimum of twenty-one (21) days



- The following protocols for close contacts of probable, suspect, and confirmed COVID-19 cases shall hereinafter be observed:
  - a. Fully vaccinated individuals who are close contacts of confirmed COVID-19 cases may undergo a seven (7)-day quarantine period, provided that the individual remains asymptomatic for the duration of the seven-day period with the first day being the date immediately after the last exposure.
  - b. If (RT-PCR) Test needs to be performed on the asymptomatic individual, it may be tested not earlier than the fifth day after the date of the last exposure.
  - c. For close contacts who may have been traced beyond the seventh day from last exposure and who have remained asymptomatic, no testing and quarantine shall be required.
  - d. Should the RT-PCR Test yield a positive result, or he/she becomes symptomatic, he/she shall follow the prescribed testing and isolation protocols.
  - e. Unvaccinated or partially vaccinated individuals who may be close contacts of suspect, probable, and confirmed COVID-19 cases shall undergo fourteen-day quarantine pursuant to the Department of Health Administrative Order No. 2021-0043 or the "Omnibus Guidelines on the Minimum Public Health Standards for the Safe Reopening of Institutions."

#### RULE VIII VACCINATION

- A fully vaccinated individual is someone who has more than or equal to 2
  weeks after having received the second dose in a 2-dose vaccine; or more
  than or equal to 2 weeks after having received a single-dose vaccine.
- A partially individual refers to the individual given with one dose of a twodose series vaccine.
- The Mega Vaccination Facility located at the Jesse M. Robredo Coliseum to cover more vaccinees from the different spectra of society shall open the following vaccination bays on the following days:

 Boosters for the adult population shall also be continuously rolled-out to the barangays, communities, schools, churches, and institutions by the offsite vaccination team to hasten its inoculation.

# RULE IX IMPLEMENTATION AND REPORTORIAL REQUIREMENT

 The members of the Health Emergency Response Task Force shall ensure faithful implementation of these rules and are directed to submit its report to the Secretary to the Mayor for collation on days indicated below:

## RULE X OTHER PROVISIONS

- This Executive Order may be amended from time to time, as the need arises, in view of the fast-developing COVID-19 situation.
- Should any provision of this Order or any part thereof be declared invalid, the other provisions, insofar as they are separable from the invalid ones, shall remain in full force and effect.
- All executive issuances or parts thereof inconsistent with this Order are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.
- This Executive Order shall take effect on January 9, 2022.
