**RECONSTITUTING THE RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT FUND  
ASSISTANCE REVIEW COMMITTEE**

**WHEREAS**, Naga City Ordinance No. 2019-090, otherwise known as the "Naga City Research and Development Fund Assistance Ordinance," was enacted to institutionalize the grant of financial and technical assistance to qualified individuals, groups, and institutions engaged in research and development projects that contribute to the city's development goals;

**WHEREAS**, Section 11 of the said Ordinance provides for the creation of a Research and Development Fund Assistance Review Committee tasked to evaluate, review, and recommend for approval research and development proposals for funding;

**WHEREAS**, there is a need to reconstitute the said Committee to ensure its continued effective and efficient performance, align its membership with current organizational structures, and strengthen inter-office coordination in implementing the Ordinance;

**NOW THEREFORE, I, MARIA LEONOR G. ROBREDO**, Mayor of Naga City, by virtue of the powers vested in me by law, do hereby order the following:

**SECTION 1. CONSTITUTION OF THE RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT FUND ASSISTANCE REVIEW COMMITTEE.** The Research and Development Fund Assistance Review Committee is hereby reconstituted with the following composition:

Representative from the Metro Naga Chamber of  
Commerce and Industry (MNCCI)

**SECTION 2. FUNCTIONS.** The Committee shall have the following functions:

- a. Review and evaluate research and development proposals submitted for funding under the Naga City Research and Development Fund Assistance Program;
- b. Ensure that proposals are aligned with the city's development priorities, policies, and plans;
- c. Recommend to the City Mayor the approval or disapproval of proposals and the amount of assistance to be granted;
- d. Monitor and evaluate the implementation of approved projects; and
- e. Perform such other functions as may be necessary to implement the provisions of Ordinance No. 2019-090.

**SECTION 3. RESEARCH FOCAL OFFICE AND SECRETARIAT.** The City Planning and Development Office (CPDO) is hereby designated as the Research and Development Focal Office and shall act as the secretariat of the Review Committee and is in-charge of the processing of fund releases of approved proposals.

**SECTION 4. MEETINGS AND QUORUM.** The Committee shall meet at least once every quarter or as often as necessary to review and act upon submitted proposals. A majority of the members shall constitute a quorum.

**SECTION 5. FUNDING.** The operational requirements of the Committee shall be charged to the appropriate funds allocated under Ordinance No. 2019-090, subject to the usual accounting and auditing rules and regulations.

**SECTION 6. REPEALING CLAUSE.** All issuances and orders or parts thereof inconsistent with the provisions of this Executive Order are hereby repealed, amended or modified accordingly.

**SECTION 7. EFFECTIVITY.** This Order shall take effect immediately and shall remain in effect unless otherwise revoked or amended, or until superseded by an Ordinance.

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING A RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT ASSISTANCE FUND, PROVIDING GUIDELINES FOR ITS GRANT AND ADMINISTRATION, APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREOF, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

As the saying goes, we cannot make informed decisions without unbiased information. A product of research is an unbiased information.

The City Government of Naga is one with the nation in acknowledging that the rise and development of the country in terms of economy, education and culture is being realized faster through the application of research and development. Researches contribute much to the progress of the community, the city, and the country as a whole.

As such, numerous government agencies such as DOST, CHED, TESDA and other private entities and organizations offer grants-in-aid and funding support to research and development with the aim to harness the country's scientific and technological capabilities and eventually spur and attain sustainable economic growth and development. In Congress legislative measures that further provide fund support to this undertaking are being studied.

However, data from the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO) reveals that among the ASEAN nations, the Philippines ranks second to the last in investments in research and development— investing only 0.14% of the Gross Domestic Product (GDP) in 2003— higher only than that of Indonesia who invested only 0.05% of its GDP. UNESCO recommends that for a developing nation, at least 1% of its GDP should be invested in research and development. Hence, our country has been surpassed by its neighbors in terms of economy seemingly because we are not investing much in research and development. Lack of necessary funding support to researches makes it hard to be pursued and realized. This lack of financial

support or under-investments results in lower technological outputs and innovations in terms of quantity and quality. It also results in lower numbers of graduates, workers and practitioners in the fields of engineering and other science-related courses who support the industry, with many of them opting to work abroad or venture in other fields.

Research endeavors shall henceforth be given focus and shall be provided with the necessary financial aid from the city government.

The establishment of a research and development fund would empower the students and teachers and educational institutions as well to put into reality their academic pursuits.

This ordinance will also encourage and strengthen the public and private sector linkages in the generation of technologies needed in accelerating Naga City's development.

Moreover, this Ordinance will further enhance the city's competitiveness.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Sangguniang Panlungsod of the City of Naga, that:

SECTION 1. – *TITLE*. – This ordinance shall be known as the “*Research and Development Assistance Fund Ordinance of Naga City*”.

SECTION 2. – *DECLARATION OF POLICY AND RESEARCH AGENDA*. – The City Government of Naga recognizes the indispensable and essential role of science and technology in today's modern world. It adheres with the State policy to give priority to research and development, invention, innovation, and their utilization.

As part of its research agenda, the City Government likewise takes into consideration the 2016-2022 Regional Research and Development (R&D) Agenda for the Bicol Region.

SECTION 3. – *PURPOSE*. – This ordinance seeks to establish a Research and Development Assistance Fund (RDAF) that will augment the financial needs of the students, teachers, educational institutions, private organizations and other entities associated in research and development undertakings. The ultimate goal is to have a positive impact on the lives of the Nagueños and the strengthening of its academic and non-academic institutions.

SECTION 4. – *DEFINITION OF TERMS*. – For the purpose of this ordinance, the following terms and phrases shall have these definitions:

- (a) *Project/Research Proposal* – refers to the plan and description of the project or research developed by the Project Proponent/s, and submitted to the City Government for grant of financial assistance;
- (b) *Project Proponent/s* – refers to a student or group of students, faculty or faculties, public or private academic institutions, or other entities who prepare and submit project or research proposal for City Government's approval and assistance;
- (c) *Research and development* – shall mean any systematic and creative work undertaken to increase the stock of knowledge, including knowledge of man, culture, and society, and the use of this stock knowledge to devise new applications. It is used to establish or confirm facts, reaffirm the results of previous work, solve new or existing problems, support theorems, or develop new theories. It also includes extension or technology transfer activities;
- (d) *Research Impact* – An effect on, change or benefit to the economy, society, culture, public policy or services, health, the environment or quality of life, beyond academia.  
It includes an effect, change or benefit to:
- The activity, attitude awareness, behavior, capacity, opportunity, performance, policy, practice, process or understanding;
  - Of an audience, beneficiary, community, constituency, organization or individuals;
  - In any geographic location whether locally, regionally, nationally or internationally.
- (e) *Scientific and technological services* – shall mean any activity concerned with scientific and experimental development; and contributes to the generation, dissemination and application of scientific and technical knowledge;
- (f) *Scientific and technical education and training* – shall refer to activities comprising higher education and trainings leading to university degree; post graduate and further trainings or organized lifelong-trainings for scientist and engineers; and specialized non-university education;
- (g) *Student/s* – includes those students who are currently enrolled in any public or private educational institutions within or outside the jurisdiction of Naga City, whether in secondary (junior and senior high schools), college degree, or post-graduate students;
- (h) *Other scientific purposes* – shall include research equipment and acquisition of materials for research and such other tools or paraphernalia

needed in the conduct of research and development and technology transfer;

- (i) *Memorandum of Funding Agreement* – refers to an agreement executed by the Project Proponent/s and the City Government of Naga which provides their duties and responsibilities and other conditions regarding the grant of financial assistance.

**SECTION 5. – QUALIFICATIONS OF THE PROPONENTS.** – The following qualifications shall be observed in the availment of the research and development assistance fund:

- (a) Academe – which includes student/s, faculty/ies or educational institution:
  - a.1 Students who are currently enrolled/studying in any public or private educational institutions **within** Naga City, either individually or as a group, as certified by school or department head;
  - a.2 Nagueño students who are currently enrolled/studying in any public or private educational institutions **outside** Naga City, either individually or as a group, as certified by school or department head;
  - a.3 Faculty members who are currently teaching, whether full time or part time, in a public or private elementary, secondary, college or university **within** Naga City, either individually or as a group, as certified by the school head;
  - a.4 Public or private academic institutions, whether elementary, secondary or tertiary within the jurisdiction of Naga City proposing a project under the name of the institution or school, shall be endorsed by the head of the institution; provided if the school head is the applicant/proponent, it shall be endorsed by the head of the agency;
  - a.5 In anticipation of group projects to be submitted, only those which have hurdled intra-school contest which qualify the same as entry in inter-school competition, shall be considered. The merits thereof shall be evaluated by the Review committee.
- (b) Barangay officials, research group/s, non-government organizations, which shall endorsed by the head of the agency or institution. Private individuals shall be endorsed by the barangay captain of his/her residence.

**SECTION 6. – SCOPE OF RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT ACTIVITIES QUALIFIED FOR FUNDING ASSISTANCE** – The following activities involved in the conduct of research and development shall be qualified for funding assistance:

- (a) Fundamental/Basic Research – refers to experimental or theoretical work undertaken primarily to acquire new knowledge on underlying phenomena and observable facts geared to come up with information toward the solution of a specific problem that has not been solved before (oriented basic research).  
This category includes natural and social sciences among other areas.
- (b) Applied Research – refers to investigation undertaken in order to utilize data/information gathered from fundamental/basic researches or to acquire new knowledge directed primarily towards a specific practical aim or objective with direct benefit to society.
- (c) Experimental Development – refers to systematic work that draws from existing knowledge gained from research and/or practical experience that is directed to produce new materials, products and devices, install new processes, systems and services, and substantially improve those already produced or installed.
- (d) Pilot Testing – refers to innovative scaled-up (greater than laboratory or bench scale) activity aimed at gaining experience that may lead to further technical improvement of product or production process, and setting the parameters before the technology transfer of the process/product and design of equipment.

SECTION 7. – *DOCUMENTARY REQUIREMENTS.* – The Project/Research Proponent s, through its Project/Research Leader, shall submit the following documents, which shall include among others:

- (1) Letter of application for assistance, which indicates among others, the following:
  - (a) brief introduction of the project/research;
  - (b) statement that the proponent/s has no sufficient financial capability to undertake the project/research on their own;
- (2) Approval of the title of project research proposal, including abstract (to be certified by the school or department head)
- (3) Breakdown of funding assistance being requested;
- (4) Endorsement of the project research from the institution where the proponent/s are currently enrolled or working.
- (5) Other documents necessary that will support the approval for funding assistance.

SECTION 8. – *SELECTION CRITERIA.* – The Review Committee, in its consideration of the proposal/s submitted, shall study the intended results of the research. Among others, it shall consider the impact in terms of formulating policy and programs for the city government and its different departments, as well as those which will improve the operations of existing public programs. This is to align with the basic goal of using public funds for public purpose.

The proposal may also take into consideration the approved Regional Research and Development (R&D) Agenda for Bicol Region adopted by the Regional Development Council (RDC) for 2016-2022.

In furtherance of the over-all objective set forth in the preceding paragraphs of this Section, the Committee may also consider the following, to wit:

- (a) Scientific merit – sound scientific basis to generate new knowledge or to apply existing knowledge in an innovative manner;
- (b) Potential Techno-takers as Partners – the project should identify the possible and potential adopter/s of the technology to be developed;
- (c) Plans for Research Utilization – project research proposal highlight plans on how research and development results will be used by the potential end-user/s or adopters;
- (d) Institutional Capacity mechanism – ability of the institution to implement the project/research using their existing and proposed facilities;
- (e) Potential Socio-Economic Impact – potential of the project/research to create/provide employment, increase income, and address current and pressing problems on employment and livelihood, among others;
- (f) Potential Environmental, Health, Public Safety and Disaster Management Impact – the project research that strongly considers the effect on the environment, public health, public safety and disaster management;
- (g) Political, Cultural and Gender Sensitivity – adaptability and acceptability of the project/research to political context, culture, tradition, gender and development of the city, and the country;
- (h) Science and Technology – refers to scientific research and development, promotion and commercialization of technology, dissemination and application of scientific and technical knowledge in all field of natural science and technology;

- (i) Proponent/s competence and commitment to undertake the project/research based on experience, training and track record.

**SECTION 9. – EXTENT OF FUNDING ASSISTANCE FOR QUALIFIED PROPOSAL.** – The decision of the City Government to grant/extend any amount is proposal-dependent. The Review Committee, taking into consideration the benefits or impact of the proposal on the lives and well-being of Nagueños and its institutions, shall recommend the amount based from its thorough evaluation and study of the proposal. The amount to be granted, however, shall not exceed maximum of Fifty thousand Pesos (P50,000.00).

**SECTION 10. – GUIDELINES ON THE ACQUISITION, REVIEW, APPROVAL, AND RELEASE OF FUNDING ASSISTANCE.** – The following guidelines shall govern the acquisition, review, approval, and release of funding assistance to qualified proponents:

- (a) The Proponent/s shall submit the proposal and supporting documents as provided in Section 8 above to the Office of the City Mayor, which shall refer the same to the Sangguniang Panlungsod. If the proposal is submitted to the Sangguniang Panlungsod and after referral to the Committee on Appropriations, the steps indicated in the following sub-sections shall be observed;
- (b) The proposal shall be forwarded to the Review Committee thru City Planning and Development Office (CPDO). The Committee will conduct a thorough review of the proposal. The Committee shall make a recommendation thereof within ten (10) working days from receipt;
- (c) If the Committee finds the proposal to be in order and eligible for funding assistance, it shall recommend approval, with the corresponding amount to be granted. If the Committee finds it not in order, it shall be returned to the proponent/s, incorporating comments and suggestions for modification and possible re-submission;
- (d) Proposal/s approved by the Review Committee shall then be forwarded to the Sangguniang Panlungsod Committee on Appropriations. The Appropriations Committee, after hearing, may then recommend approval to the plenary.

In furtherance hereto, the Sangguniang Panlungsod, in its sound discretion, may invite the proponent/s to explain the salient points of the research for its appreciation.

- (e) Upon approval of the proposal, a Memorandum of Funding Agreement shall be issued by the City Government thru the CPDO. All necessary and

supporting documents shall be submitted to the said office for processing and release, subject to existing accounting and auditing procedures.

Provided, that after all the required documents for processing have been submitted, the CPDO shall exert all efforts, in coordination with the appropriate agencies, to expedite the release of the funding assistance, which shall be within fifteen (15) days after the receipt of the complete documents.

A suitable time frame of forty five (45) days from submission, hearing and processing of qualified research/project is hereby mandated under this ordinance. The Committee may then call the attention in writing of the concerned offices in order to achieve the intent of this Ordinance.

**SECTION 11. - CREATION OF THE REVIEW COMMITTEE, FUNCTIONS AND DESIGNATION OF RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT FOCAL OFFICE.** - A Review Committee that will conduct thorough review and recommend action on any proposal/s for funding assistance is hereby created to be composed of the following:

**11. a. Composition**

Chairman of the SP Committee on Education -- Chairman;

Members:

- i. Representative from City Mayor's Office (Community Relations Office)
- ii. Representative from the City Engineer's Office
- iii. Representative from the City Planning and Development Office
- iv. Representative from the Metro PESO
- v. Representative from the Naga City People's Council (NCPC) representing the women sector
- vi. Representative from the Metro Naga Chamber of Commerce and Industry (MNCCI)

**11. b Functions**

b.1) The Committee shall study, evaluate and review submitted proposal/s based on the time frame hereunto set. It shall recommend actions, including possible amount of assistance to the Sangguniang Panlungsod thru the Committee on Appropriation, as stated in Section 10 hereof.

b.2) The Committee shall take into consideration the approved Regional Research and Development (R&D) Agenda for Bicol Region adopted by the Regional Development Council (RDC) for 2016-2022 as well as the city's socio-economic development priorities in its consideration of submitted proposals.

b.3) The Committee may invite experts to provide technical guidance in the conduct of the review. In line with this, the Chair is authorized to invite

professional and/or technical assistance which he sees fit to help in the review of the proposal/s submitted.

b.4) The Committee shall inform the Sangguniang Panlungsod of the need to augment the Research and Development Fund, if necessary.

b.5) The Committee shall likewise recommend to the Sangguniang Panlungsod periodic assessment of the implementation of this Ordinance with the end in view of reinforcing the research agenda and policy of the city government

#### 11.c. Research Focal Office

c.1) The City Planning and Development Office (CPDO) is hereby designated as the Research and Development Focal Office. For this purpose, the CPDO shall act as a secretariat of the Review Committee and is in-charge of the processing of fund releases of approved proposals.

c.2) It shall also act as repository of records of all proposals submitted and approved.

c.3) The CPDO shall likewise facilitate coordination with other offices to assist researcher/s in the conduct of their work.

**SECTION 12. – MONITORING OF ASSISTED PROJECT/RESEARCH.** – A monitoring guidelines is hereby set forth to check compliance thereto:

(a) The Proponent/s shall submit a progress report on the conduct of project/research, which shall contain among others, the accomplished results of the project/research.

(b) Upon completion of the project research, a final terminal report shall be submitted to the CPDO by the Proponent/s, which shall include the utilization of the financial assistance granted, and other technical matters concerning the project/research. Validation and evaluation on the submitted terminal report and the completed research papers shall be conducted by the CPDO. Such evaluation shall be submitted to the Review Committee for monitoring and future reference.

(c) For failure of the Proponent/s to submit the required progress and final reports within the prescribed deadlines, demand letters shall be sent to the Proponent/s.

(d) For their failure despite demands, the CPDO may recommend to the City Mayor to prevent the same Proponent/s from receiving further financial

assistance or any support from the City Government until he/she/they are cleared from all obligations pertinent to financial assistance received.

**SECTION 13. - RECOGNITION OF OUTSTANDING RESEARCH CONDUCTED.** - There shall be an annual recognition of the outstanding research conducted, the mechanics of which are to be determined by the Review Committee.

Moreover, to enhance the efforts of the City Government in highlighting the importance of researches, the CPDO shall issue guidelines on the conduct of colloquiums. It shall coordinate with the different agencies and institutions for their active participation on this activity.

**SECTION 14. - DECLARATION OF A RESEARCH COLLOQUIUM WEEK. -** To enhance the efforts of the City Government in highlighting the importance of researches, it is hereby declared a suitable week within the month of April and every year thereafter as a Research Colloquium Week. The City Government shall implement programs that will highlight the importance of researches. The recognition of outstanding researches shall be held during this weeklong celebration

**SECTION 15. - FULL DISCLOSURE POLICY. -**

- (a) The financial assistance for research and development granted in this ordinance shall cover all offices and departments of the City Government of Naga. The same project/research proposal submitted to one or more offices including those submitted to city officials for funding support shall be considered as one.
- (b) In case the proponent/s of the project research already submitted the same proposal to other national agency ies for funding support, the proponent/s must disclose it when said project research is submitted to the City Government.
- (c) Failure to observe shall be a strong basis to deny the same and the City Government may proceed to prosecute proponents for violations of this ordinance as herein below provided.

**SECTION 16. - OWNERSHIP OF RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT OUTPUT AND INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY. -** Considering that the City Government thru this ordinance is just assisting in the pursuit of research by means of augmenting financial capacity of the proponent/s, the following provisions shall govern in the ownership of research and development output and its intellectual property:

- (a) The ownership of the research shall belong to the proponent/s; provided, that the City Government shall be granted rights to use the research output in its policy or decision making processes;

- (b) Intellectual properties developed by the proponent/s as part or outside of its research and their corresponding copyrights and/or patents shall belong to the proponent/s, even if the proponent/s used the time, facilities, materials or financially assisted by the City Government, unless otherwise stipulated in a separate agreement between the proponent/s and the City Government;
- (c) The above provisions shall apply in proportion to the intellectual properties developed by the proponent/s, unless otherwise stipulated in a separate agreement between the proponent/s and the City Government.

SECTION 17. - *PENALTY.* - Any student or group of students, faculty or faculties, public or private academic institutions, or other entities found to have obtained financial assistance for the same project/research proposal under the provisions of this ordinance, to any official, office or agency of the City Government of Naga, by employing deceit or fraud, and found to have violated the provisions of Section 15 above, shall be held liable, after court's determination, with the following:

- (a) 1<sup>st</sup> Offense - a fine of One Thousand Pesos (P1,000.00), and stern written warning from the City Government of Naga;
- (b) 2<sup>nd</sup> Offense - a fine of Three Thousand Pesos (P3,000.00), and Removal from the list of qualified applicants;
- (c) 3<sup>rd</sup> Offense - a fine of Five Thousand Pesos (P5,000.00) and/or imprisonment of not more than six (6) months at the discretion of the court.

SECTION 18. - *APPROPRIATIONS.* - The amount necessary to cover the initial implementation of this ordinance for the remaining months of fiscal year 2019 is hereby set aside for the purpose.

For ensuing years, an amount of P3M or such amount necessary shall be allocated and included in the City's Annual Appropriations Ordinance under the Special Education Fund (SEF) subject to approval of the School Board.

SECTION 19. - *GRANT OF HONORARIA TO THE REVIEW COMMITTEE MEMBERS.* - As a token of gratitude and in recognition of their invaluable contribution, the grant of honorarium to the Review Committee members is hereby authorized in the amount of Five Hundred Pesos (P500.00) per review day they actually attended or participated, subject to all relevant accounting and auditing laws, rules and regulations.

**SECTION 20. - JOINT LEGISLATIVE AND EXECUTIVE OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE.** - There is hereby created a Joint Legislative and Executive Oversight Committee to monitor and oversee the implementation of this Ordinance. The Committee shall be composed of three (3) members from the Sangguniang Panlungsod, namely the chairmen of the Committees on Education, Public Safety and Youth Affairs; the City Administrator, the Head of City Events, Protocol and Public Information Office (CEPPIO), the Head of the Education, Sports and Scholarships Office and the Chief of Raul S. Roco Library. They shall choose from among themselves the Chair of the Oversight Committee.

**SECTION 21. - REPEALING CLAUSE.** - Any and all previous ordinances, administrative orders, rules and regulations or part thereof that are inconsistent with this ordinance are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

**SECTION 22. - SEPARABILITY CLAUSE.** - If any or provisions of this ordinance shall be held unconstitutional or invalid, the other parts of provision hereof, which are not affected thereby, shall continue to be in full force and effect.

**SECTION 23. - EFFECTIVITY.** - This ordinance shall take effect after publication in a newspaper of local circulation.


