



**EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 063**

**STRONGLY ADVISING PRIVATE ESTABLISHMENTS TO PRIORITIZE  
EMPLOYEE SAFETY BY SUSPENDING WORK OPERATIONS DUE TO THE  
EXPECTED STRONG RAINS AND WINDS FROM TYPHOON 'UWAN'**

**WHEREAS**, based on the latest weather advisory from the Philippine Atmospheric, Geophysical and Astronomical Services Administration (PAGASA), Typhoon "Uwan" is expected to bring strong rains and winds over parts of Bicol Region, including the City of Naga, which may result in flooding, landslides, and other weather-related hazards;

**WHEREAS**, the City Government deems it necessary to ensure the safety of residents, particularly workers and commuters who may be affected by deteriorating weather conditions later this afternoon;

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to Republic Act No. 10121, otherwise known as the *Philippine Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Act of 2010*, local government units are mandated to adopt measures to safeguard lives and property during disasters and emergencies;

**NOW, THEREFORE, I, MARIA LEONOR G. ROBREDO**, Mayor of the City of Naga by virtue of the powers vested in me under Republic Act No. 7160, otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991, do hereby order the following:

1. All owners and operators of private offices, establishments, and business enterprises within the City of Naga are **STRONGLY ADVISED** to prioritize employee safety by suspending work operations and allowing employees to leave work early, as necessary, today, November 9, 2025.
2. This advisory applies to employees who may still be scheduled to report for work later today, in view of the expected strong rains and winds brought by Typhoon "Uwan."

3. Employees who are unable to report for work due to imminent danger from the typhoon shall not be subject to any administrative sanction, in accordance with existing labor regulations.
4. Establishments engaged in essential, emergency, and continuous operations (such as medical services, utilities, and other critical facilities) may continue operations as necessary, provided that appropriate safety precautions are observed.
5. The City Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office (CDRRMO), through the Incident Management Team (IMT), is directed to continue monitoring weather conditions, coordinate with PAGASA and relevant agencies, and issue timely advisories as necessary.
6. All barangays and concerned offices are enjoined to disseminate this Executive Order immediately and take appropriate actions to ensure the safety of their constituents.

This Executive Order shall take effect immediately and shall be valid only for today, November 9, 2025.
